A MESSAGE FROM REVD. JOHN BESWICK PALLISTER

All I want for Christmas is...

What is Christmas all about for you? The family gathering? The presents? The turkey? A walk on Christmas Day when you feel like you can't move after eating so much?

For me, *family* and *Christmas pudding* are two of the key ingredients. Having grown up in Portugal, I had lots of delicacies at Christmas, but I didn't discover Christmas pudding until I was an adult. There is no going back now!

I suspect we're ready to say goodbye to 2020, a crazy and difficult year – but it would be great to have something of a normal Christmas before we finish, wouldn't it? But of course, we don't know what things will be like. And because of this, it's very tempting either to feel glum, or to throw ourselves into the busy-ness of making alternative plans – online shopping, Zoom family gatherings, etc.

However, I think there is a better way to go about this. When we remember the first Christmas, we have images of blissful nativity scenes, with well-behaved animals and a baby Jesus that doesn't cry. If only nativity scenes could replicate the smells of a stable, then we'd get more of the picture of how messy the whole thing was!

It started with an unplanned and irregular pregnancy. Then, there was

that long journey on donkey back, for a very pregnant Mary. Joseph is totally frustrated that he can't even find a room for the birth. They weren't in lockdown, but they couldn't be with family at this most crucial time. The forced journey was brought about by greedy politicians who were making everyone go and register, so they could charge taxes.

And then the first people to come and meet the baby are smelly (and probably dodgy) shepherds.

It doesn't get messier than this – but this isn't an accident. This messy birth is the beginning of a life that comes to its climax at the cross, where Jesus took all our mess (also known as sin) on himself, dying on our behalf, so that he could un-mess our lives and the whole world.

As we celebrate Christmas in 2020, I invite you to look away from all the mess in and around us, and to look with fresh eyes at the nativity scene, the messy but beautiful start of a new story – a story of God entering the mess, to take it all away, to give you a new life.

So – in church or online – come and join us this Christmas for some festive joy!





A message from our new Vicar



As we journey towards Christmas and the end of 2020 we may well be feeling many different things. Many of us will be glad to see the back of 2020. Many will be excited by the promise of 2021. Many will be worried that 2021 will just be 2020 version 2.0. Many will be holding to wonderful memories of 2020. Many will be longing to forget the hardships of the year.

This year I attended my nan's funeral via a video link, seven hours' drive away from the funeral

chapel – I hope I never have to attend a funeral by video link again. This year our family welcomed baby Joshua into the world, back at the height of the first lockdown - his birth was a sign of hope and life in the midst of the most difficult of years.

From the end of January 2021 I will be the new vicar of All Saints' Madeley and St. Margaret's Betley, so I should really be doing the proper vicar thing of saying that just as baby Joshua was a sign of hope for our family in dark times, the birth of baby Jesus some 2000-odd years ago was a sign of hope in dark times you get where this is going. But I'm not going to go there for two reasons:

1. Because baby Joshua isn't the messiah, and he's not even a very naughty boy (thank you Monty Python).

2. And also because this isn't the time for twee and overly sentimental answers all wrapped up in swaddling cloth....

My family and I are really excited to be moving to Madeley in January and can't wait to explore some of these ideas with you in the years to come. In the meantime, peace to you all, have a lovely Christmas and a hopeful beginning of 2021.

Covid 19

Recent weeks have seen a significant increase in Covid-19 cases nationally and locally. Our area (Madeley & Betley) moved from the lowest category during the summer to the highest category (over 400 cases per 100,000 population) by early November. *It has never been more important to follow health and Government guidelines*.

If you have symptoms you should arrange a test as soon as possible either via www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test or by phone on 119. We know that the system has been working well locally with same-day testing and results within 24 hours. While you are awaiting your test appointment or the test results you must self-isolate, and clearly if you have a positive test result you and your household must self-isolate for the necessary period. Our community has always had a reputation for looking after each other and by taking these measures we can protect each other's health.

Acts of Remembrance

The Parish Council was involved in village Acts of Remembrance though they were very different this year. On Remembrance Sunday, the Chairman and Vice Chairman met on the Memorial Garden, with their families at a social distance. They observed the two minutes' silence and laid a wreath on behalf of the community. Then in church the Chairman laid a wreath at the Memorial Window. This year the otherwise empty church had added poignancy. The church bell marked the two minutes' silence.

On Wednesday 11th November the Chairman and Vice Chairman were joined on the Memorial Garden by pupils from school for an Act of Remembrance. The service was led by the Revd. John Beswick Pallister. As in the last three years, each pupil was given a reproduction copy of the New Testament as supplied to the troops 1914-1918. The Chairman introduced the Act of Remembrance by saying that although children at the present time could not live life as usual and enjoy parties, meet their friends in their homes, and play sports, earlier generations of children had also suffered hardships. However, earlier generations of children had also suffered great sadness in that their relatives had gone off to fight, and possibly die, in two World Wars. As an example, the Chairman's great uncle's eldest son, who flew as a rear gunner in Lancaster bombers, was shot down and killed in 1942.

Christmas Activities

In accordance with instructions received from Father Christmas, and also with the assistance of the Chief Elf who made the arrangements, there will be something different and very special on the Memorial Garden this year. Father Christmas thought the Chief Elf could manage something better than a Christmas tree, for this Covid-19 Christmas! *Children in the village are*

Invited to enjoy them, but are asked **not** to look at them with their hands! The special items will be removed from the garden soon after Twelfth Night although the lights in the trees at the back of the Memorial Garden will remain illuminated during January and February. We hope you will all enjoy the new display and that it will provide some cheer during these difficult times.

Although Father Christmas will not be around to turn on the lights this year, the Prime Minister has asked the Parish Council to advise all children that Father Christmas is regarded as a key worker under the Coronavirus Regulations and will deliver presents to children overnight on 24th/25th December as usual.

Neighbourhood Plan

The Parish Council would like to thank the members of the Neighbourhood Plan Working Group, in particular the Chairman, Richard Head, whose initiative to revise the Parish Plan resulted in the development of our Neighbourhood Plan. Thank you to everyone who responded to the Consultation on the Draft Neighbourhood Plan. We will take account of all the feedback received as we produce the Final Plan to go to referendum, hopefully in May 2021.

Finally, the Parish Council normally sends seasonal greetings to the Parish at this time. However, such bonhomie is difficult to muster as, at the time of writing we are in the midst of Lockdown2. But there is now more than a ray of hope that, going into 2021, life will return to normal at some stage in the next year. We also know that there is better treatment for those unfortunate enough to have caught the virus, so we can travel in hope with more confidence. May you have a peaceful and blessed Christmas, remembering and valuing those things that matter, and praying and thinking of others who are even less fortunate. I am sure we all hope for a better year in 2021.

The Council does not meet in December unless a special meeting is needed. The next scheduled meeting will be on Thursday 28th January (probably on Zoom). 

Heroic Hedgehogs (Year 3 and 4)

What an amazing start to the academic year it has been from the children in Heroic Hedgehogs (Year 3 and Year 4). After a seemingly never-ending time away from the classroom, the children have well and truly hit the ground running - returning to school with an infectious enthusiasm and hunger for learning!

We began the year by exploring the exciting topic of Groovy Greeks. The

children learnt all about the exploits of Alexander the Great and the mighty empire he built, stretching from the shores of the Adriatic all the way to the Indus Valley. They compared the various Greek city states - particularly focusing on Athens and Sparta - and listed the similarities and differences between them. The children explored how the concept of democracy began in ancient Athens - but identified that this early form of democracy was quite different from what we would recognise today.



The children produced a wide variety of fantastic pieces of creative writing based on this wonderful topic - such as newspaper reports, letters and nonchronological reports. The children particularly enjoyed writing an entry into the diary of Pheidippides - the legendary messenger who ran from the Battle of Marathon to the city of Athens, a distance of twenty-six-and-a-half miles.

We've got plenty more exciting lessons and investigations planned for this year. Last week we began our next topic - USA Road Trip! The children have already fallen in love with this topic and are very excited about what they're going to be learning. We're all particularly looking forward our upcoming Design and Technology project - creating a model Saturn V rocket, the rocket used to blast the lunar module into space during the Apollo 11 missions. We can't wait to get started!

French Day in the Infants

On Monday 8th November the children took part in a day to celebrate the country of France. They learnt how to count to twenty in French, how to greet their friends and the vocabulary for some popular colours and foods. After finding out about the Eiffel Tower, they set themselves a challenge to



a French cartoon whilst eating croissants!

A fun day was had by all.

End of season report

Well what a year, we had so many plans and then had to change them all!

Owing to restrictions imposed to limit the spread of Covid-19, the opening of the bowling season was delayed until 20th May. The club opened with 27 members and by following Government and British Crown Green Bowling Association guidance, and with the tremendous work of the committee and support of the membership, we remained in operation until 25th October having increased the membership to 37. All activities were risk assessed and rules to keep people safe were communicated to all.

Our programme of publicity and social events could not take place, and league and friendly matches had to be cancelled. We did however hold social bowling sessions and competitions, including some with trophies for the winners between our club players. The atmosphere at the club was really positive and vibrant and we were all glad to be able to have fun playing on the green together. To reflect the reduction in available activities, including the closure of the pavilion, subscriptions were reduced to £20 for members and £15 for new members.

Funds were generated through donations from Betley Bonfire committee, club members, and other donors. The introduction of a new lottery proved popular and greatly boosted the revenue.

Two essential pieces of equipment were purchased: a mower and a spiker, both second hand but refurbished and reliable. The impact has been a much improved playing surface on the green. Treatment of the green and various maintenance activities will continue through the closed season.

Finally, we have had a good year under challenging times and been able to keep bowling whilst members have stayed safe and well. We look forward to seeing members in 2021 on the green and welcoming new members to the club. Meanwhile, here's a little taster for you. Why not make your own and join us with a cup of tea and piece of tiffin?

Cranberry and Ginger Tiffin

Time: 30 minutes plus setting time

Makes: 12 - Really easy

You can send this off in a lovely jar or box as it's a super indulgent tiffin treat for someone as a festive gift. White Chocolate looks great and but you can swap the white chocolate for dark or milk, whichever is their favourite.



Ingredients

Ginger biscuits 200g Dried cranberries 60g Crystallised ginger 60g, plus more for the top Pecan nuts 50g, roughly chopped Butter 125g Golden syrup 2 tbsp White (or your favourite) chocolate 700g, chopped

Line a 20cm brownie tin with baking paper. Crush the biscuits by putting them in a bag and smashing them with a rolling pin, then tip them into a bowl and add the cranberries, ginger and pecans.

Put the butter, golden syrup and 500g white chocolate in a heatproof bowl, and melt them in a microwave – or by setting the bowl over a pan of simmering water – until you have a smooth mixture. Pour this over the biscuit mix and stir until everything is coated. Spoon the mixture into the tin and press down. Melt the rest of the chocolate and spread it on top, then shake the tin to settle the surface. Top with more chopped ginger if you like. Leave to cool and set completely (put it in the fridge if you need to). Lift the tiffin out of the tin, cut into squares and gift wrap.
