A MESSAGE FROM REVD. TIM WATSON

We are delighted to bring you the first regular letter from our new vicar.



And we're off! It feels like 2021 has only just begun and yet we have already gone through so much! After the positive and exciting

news about Covid-19 vaccines at the end of 2020, January 2021 has seen us step back into lockdown as cases of Covid-19 spiral out of control. We've got a more contagious variant that emerged in the south of the country, and then we have news of a new variant emerging in South America. It seems like some of the joy of news about the vaccines has lost some of its sparkle. There is good news, there are things to be hopeful about and yet...

We know people who've had to go back into isolation. We know people who have been infected with this new strain. We know children who had gone back to school who are now back taking lessons online.

Every week seems to bring a new news conference, new statistics, new hopes, new worries, threats, hope, fear, hope, worry, fear, hope, worry, fear, hope and on and on and on in a seemingly neverending cycle. These changeable times can feel unnerving, the sands shift continually beneath our feet. For some in our communities where folk once felt secure they may now feel a lack of security. For some in our communities where folk once felt insecure, they may now feel positively at risk of falling. Our natural instinct may be to stand together with our neighbours and form stronger bonds of support and encouragement, and yet here is where the Covid-19 pandemic has cut very deeply. In this crisis we may well be feeling disempowered from being able to be there with and for our neighbours. Covid-19 has torn at the hearts of community and those threads of connection feel stretched and tattered.

As we journey on through this phase of the pandemic we need to keep thinking of safe ways that we can support and care for our neighbours and community. But more than just this, as the pandemic continues we need to guard our hearts against a general denigration of our care and support for our neighbours and community once this pandemic is over. While we may have had to withdraw somewhat at this time we must endeavour to keep our hearts open in love and care for our neighbours and community for such a time when we can more easily walk with one another and share life together again. In the meantime, stay safe!

IN THIS MONTH'S BETLEY PARISH NEWS ...

The big news in the village this month is the arrival of our new Vicar, Revd. Tim Watson who was formally appointed on 24th January (see page 6). We all look forward to meeting him in the near future, at least online, and as soon as possible in person. For now church services will be online (see opposite) and St Margaret's is open each day for private prayer during daylight hours. All are welcome to use this peaceful space when you need a break from the noise of the wider world. See page 13 for details of church for children and young people.

Meanwhile *Betley Parish News* will be online only until the Covid-19 guidelines change. It's feeling like a long haul but it's still critical to follow the advice to *stay home*, except for essential journeys, *wash hands* frequently, *wear a mask* when required and *keep your distance* from others. In other words: '*Act like you've got it*'.

The arrival of vaccinations is a step in the right direction, and some of our older and more vulnerable residents have already had theirs. For now we are told it's important to continue to follow the rules, even once you've had the jab. When your turn comes, you will be notified. Staffordshire Action Fraud are alerting residents to vaccine-related scams. For more information see page 22. Pauline Smith, Head of Action Fraud, has said:

"Remember, the vaccine is only available on the NHS and is free of charge. The NHS will never ask you for details about your bank account or to pay for the vaccine. If you receive an email, text message or phone call purporting to be from the NHS and you are asked to provide financial details, this is a scam."



While you wait for your vaccination, and especially once you've had it, you can help the scientists who are working hard to combat this pandemic. Over 4.5 million people are already using the '*COVID symptom study*' phone app, making it one of the biggest ever citizen science projects. It's run by King's College London and it's easy

to use. There's a daily reminder to report in (which you do whether or not you have any symptoms), and this takes about 30 seconds. You can find out more here <u>https://covid.joinzoe.com/</u> and the app is available through the usual Android and Apple sources.


Given the snowy scene across the country from Gosport (in Hampshire, Revd. Tim's last parish) to Lichfield, as well as in Betley and Madeley, perhaps it was just as well that Revd. Tim's formal appointment had always been planned to be an online service due to the Covid-19 lockdown. So it was thanks to the technology that 140 of Tim's friends and colleagues from far and wide were able to join in.

The service was a mix of formality, prayer, music and celebration. The Bishop of Lichfield the Right Revd. Dr. Michael Ipgrave formally licensed Revd. Tim as Vicar of Madeley and of Betley, in accordance with the Church of England's traditional and legal requirements. Then all the participants greeted Revd. Tim with a wave and very warm, if distanced, applause in 'gallery view', before he was officially welcomed by the Newcastle-under-Lyme Deanery of local churches, the Methodists and, on behalf of all the schools in the parishes, the headteacher from Betley School.

Revd. Tim will be well supported in his work by Ministry Teams from both parishes, and they too were commissioned by the Bishop for this next era in the lives of the churches which have been at the heart of our villages since the 12^{th} and 13^{th} centuries.

In normal circumstances the service would have been followed by hearty refreshments and especially cake, but these will have to wait until another day. Still, the service was a glad occasion giving an opportunity for so many friends to wish Revd. Tim, his wife Clare and their children Evie, Lucie and Joshua all the best as they begin their new lives here.

Christmas Lighting

The original intention was to remove the illuminated animals from the Memorial Garden at the start of on Twelfth Night. However in these dark, dank Covid times a number of residents asked if the animals could remain for longer. Accordingly the Parish Council has agreed that the animals will now remain on the Memorial Garden until early February (the end of the season of Epiphany). The lights in the trees at the back will remain for longer but a date has not been agreed for their removal. With the current restrictions on leaving home, the schools being closed, and travel being restricted families, particularly with youngsters, visiting the Memorial Garden to see the display are asked to ensure compliance with Government guidelines.

Parking Issues

With more people taking exercise within the village and the extremely muddy conditions on the fields there is a need to ensure that parking is done in an appropriate manner. By this we mean that if you are parking on a pavement, or partially on a pavement please allow space for a wheelchair, buggy or assisted walker to pass. The Parish Council has received a number of representations on this issue and councilors have noticed that some residents could park to better advantage to all.

Covid 19

As this issue goes to print we are in our third lockdown, with the new variant of Covid-19 causing particular concern. Vaccination is under way and we can only hope that will offer protection to the most vulnerable in our community. **it remains vital that we all continue to follow health guidelines**:


Do not leave your home unless necessary

Wash your hands regularly and thoroughly (or use hand sanitiser); Maintain social distancing;

Wear face coverings where appropriate or required.

If you have symptoms you should arrange a test as soon as possible either via the website <u>www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test</u> or by phone on 119. We know that the system has been working well locally with same-day testing and results within 24 hours. While you are awaiting your test appointment or the test results you must self-isolate, and if you have a positive test result you and your household must self-isolate for the necessary period.

Our community has always had a reputation for looking after each other and by taking these measures we can protect each other's health. To this extent, residents may feel that the availability of community testing in Staffordshire for those not showing symptoms is a very helpful development particularly for those who come into contact with others through employment or voluntary activities. Current information suggests that a significant number of people have the virus without displaying symptoms. As we go to print this testing is available for Staffordshire residents *without* symptoms at <u>staffordshire.zipporah.co.uk/TrackAndTrace</u> but please note this must *not* be used if you have any symptoms.



Tree Planting

The Parish Council has been approached by a local group interested in assisting with tree planting in the area. The Parish Council itself controls relatively little land suitable for planting, though at Sandy Croft we maintain both the wildlife area woodland and the community orchard. However the Council would be very happy to co-ordinate any planting on other sites in the area and to provide information on the group offering their assistance. So if there's a piece of land on which you feel tree planting would be appropriate please contact the Clerk, as below.

Neighbourhood Plan

The formal consultation on the Draft Neighbourhood Plan closed at the end of November and the Working Group has now reviewed all the responses, both from local residents and from statutory consultees (such as the Borough and County Councils, utility companies etc.) which ran to a total of over 160 pages! The Working Group and the Parish Council will be meeting to sign off any necessary changes to the Draft Plan, which will then be submitted to Newcastle Borough Council. It will then be subject to a further consultation and will be reviewed by an expert independent examiner before final approval.

The Plan will then be put before residents for approval in a local referendum. The original intention was for this to take place in May 2021, but the impact of Covid-19 may mean that this has to be put back. However, our understanding is that the policies within the Plan - which are designed to strengthen our community while protecting the area from inappropriate development - will take effect even if the local referendum has to be delayed. The Parish Council and Neighbourhood Plan team are very grateful to all those who responded.

Parish Council Website

The Parish Council recently moved its website to a new provider (largely as it offered a significant financial saving to the Council - and thus the community) and this has not been entirely straightforward, but now typing <u>www.betley-balterley-wrinehill.org.uk</u> into your search engine will take you directly to the website. We are starting to load information on local facilities and organisations to the website - *please contact the Clerk if you would like to see details of your organisation included*.

Next Meeting

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be held on **Thursday 25th February**. Again it will be a virtual meeting on Zoom. There is a fairly straightforward way for any interested residents to view the meeting, and to raise matters during the Public Participation part of the meeting. 





BETLEY LOCAL HISTORY SOCIETY

Here we are in Lockdown 3 with no prospect of meeting together in the foreseeable future. As you read this, some of us will have received the vaccine, and, hopefully, by Easter, most of our members will have done so which gives us just a little hope of a return to normality later in the year.

In the meantime, owing to the endeavours of our Newsletter Editor, Mavis Smith and the kind contributions of two of our readers, we have been able to add a *Pandemic Issue 4* Newsletter, which is free for all to read, on our Website. It is good to read of life in Betley in 1960s as it is remembered by Peter and of even more recent events described by Laura of a childhood in Betley in the early 1990s. We are the only ones who can keep a record of recent decades for the benefit of those who come behind us.

You may have seen on our Facebook page that I have been attempting to write about the Gardens of Ted and Mary Fernihough and what was happening between the big Sale of Betley Hall Estate in 1925 and the Sale of 1947 when six major Lots were sold and Fernihoughs bought the walled gardens, glasshouses, stables etc. What do we remember of Ted Fernihough? ... or of Cyril Ball who purchased Old Wood and The Lodge, part of which, in 1965/66 he donated as the present Memorial Garden in memory of his wife who had died aged 55. Who was Hugh Woolf who died in a plane crash on 16th May 1947 and caused the Sale of 13th September 1947 which was set up by instruction of his Executors? As always, too many questions and too few answers, but I hope to be able to place some of this information in a file in our Archives.

Perhaps *you* could send us one or two unrelated paragraphs of little memories ... or a piece which could be formed into the next Pandemic Newsletter. Using this 'Stay at Home' time to record more of Betley's recent history would be good.

Covid-19 Vaccination Scams

Action Fraud has received reports from members of the public who have been sent text messages claiming to be from the NHS, offering them the opportunity to sign up for coronavirus vaccinations. The texts ask the recipient to click on a link which takes them to an online form where they are prompted to input personal and financial details. In some cases the online form has looked very similar to the real NHS website.

In the UK, coronavirus vaccinations will only be available via the National Health Services of England, Northern Ireland, Wales and Scotland. You can be contacted by the NHS, your employer, a local GP surgery or pharmacy, to receive your vaccination. Remember, the vaccinations are free of charge and you will not be asked for a payment.

The NHS will never:

- ask for your bank account or card details
- ask for your PIN or banking passwords
- arrive unannounced at your home to administer the vaccine
- ask for documentation to prove your identity, such as a passport or utility bills

If you receive a call you believe to be fraudulent, hang up. If you are suspicious about an email you have received, forward it to report@phishing.gov.uk. Suspicious text messages should be forwarded to the number 7726, which is free of charge.

If you believe you are the victim of a fraud, please report this to Action Fraud as soon as possible by calling 0300 123 2040 or visiting www.actionfraud.police.uk.




