

BETLEY, BALTERLEY & WRINEHILL PARISH COUNCIL

Covid-19 (Coronavirus)

The arrangements set up by the Parish Council's VIPER Group (Village Incident Preparedness and Emergency Response) are continuing. With the support of Dr Patel the process for delivering medicines is working well, with deliveries most days. Caroline and Paul Beardsmore are doing excellent work in the village shop to ensure that the community is supplied with their requirements.

VIPER responsibilities are divided as follows:

Sebastian Daly – delivery of medicines & liaison with Dr Patel Robert Bettley-Smith - liaison with village shop and signage Richard Head - Village Hall (use of this facility has not yet been necessary) Neil Bullock - (07717 617454) police & traffic liaison.

All members keep busy and Richard, as chairman of the Neighbourhood Plan is having regular 'Zoom' meetings with the group to maintain progress on the plan. Certain actions, such as the referendum on the plan, may have to be delayed and the current expectation is that the referendum to approve the Neighbourhood Plan will be held next May (at the same time as the local elections).

Worryingly, over the last month Neil has been particularly busy as we have had a range of incidents, including crimes (burglary, attempted burglary, thefts and speeding). **We ask all residents to be particularly vigilant** and to report crime, or suspected crime, through the usual channels (101 or 999) as soon as possible. Also please advise Neil Bullock of any concerns.

VIPER details:

The Parish Council's Community Support Helpline (CSH) number is **07716 051 616**. This is primarily, for those in the community who are self-isolating and others where their needs and/or their necessary support cannot be met by family or friends.

The village shop can arrange home deliveries of food and household supplies within the Parish. The village shop number is **01270 820544**. There is now an online order form available (see Facebook page).

In conjunction with Dr Patel, medicines can be supplied direct to home. Home supply can be arranged via the surgery on **01270 820527** Or Via the Community Support Helpline, as above.



Finally, please ensure that you follow NHS guidelines in order to ensure the spread of Covid-19 is minimised and brought under control. Updated local advice is regularly posted on the Facebook page 'Betley and Wrinehill Events and Information'.

Parish Council News

The Parish Council has suspended all activities that are inconsistent with health advice. The Clerk, in consultation with the Chairman, Vice-Chairman and other Councilors, has been granted delegated powers.. This will include, for example, responding to any consultations (such as planning applications), meeting financial obligations, and taking up local issues where possible. Members of the public should contact the clerk about any matters of concern.

Communal Areas

The Memorial Garden and Sandy Croft are available for exercise but the Village Hall play area remains closed until further notice in line with Government legislation and statutory requirements. Please remember to maintain social distancing and follow any instructions from our contactors who may be working in those areas.

Waste disposal

The recycling centre at Leycett Lane has now re-opened on a limited basis (closed on Wednesdays and Thursdays). The County Council stresses that it should only be used where <u>essential</u>, and that there may be delays entering the site because of the need to maintain social distancing.

The 2020 AGM, which should have taken place in March has been postponed until the business section of our first public meeting. Once we are able to use the Methodist Chapel again our usual BLHS talks and visits will begin. As well as the restoration of the Model Farm, our programme will include: 1) Links with Betley and Maer, and 2) the History of Friendly Societies in Betley in the nineteenth century.

The Wedgwoods and Darwins of Maer Hall had contacts with people from Betley Hall and the Court and the house associated with the founder of the Royal Horticultural Society, John Wedgwood. There could be a number of letters which have never been investigated locally. To start you off you could explore the links between Emma Darwin/Wedgwood and Betley. Further information on the Friendly Societies may be found in newspaper reports online. It is always helpful to make a note of your sources with the exact references.

BETLEY METHODIST CHURCH

As you are aware, there has been little change in the Coronavirus lockdown situation. Our church and chapel buildings are still closed but a pandemic cannot keep us from communicating via new technology. While St Margaret's are excelling themselves with both video and Zoom versions of Morning Service plus the 'Thought for the Day' talented storytellers as well as children's sessions (I have watched most of them and hope that *you* are not missing out), Rev. Den has continued what began as Easter Season Services and mid-week prayers for our Rope Green Area group of Chapels.

By using conference calls some 70 people have joined in worship at 9.45am and a further 30 have chosen the 6.00pm alternative. We really feel held together by the Prayer times at 8.30pm on Tuesdays and Thursdays when we can also share various news items. I think that Rev. Den anticipated meeting with perhaps six to ten of her flock but, in fact, we have quite a rush to get through as 25-32 folk have phoned in to most sessions.

Rev. Den set up a 'Just Giving' site for Christian Aid Week on Sunday 10 May and by Monday evening £527 had been donated and by the end of the week in the region of £1,000! This was all the more amazing as the Annual Sponsored Swim organized by Malcolm Crook of Wells Green had already raised £4,000!
